

Sanatan Maity: A supporter of the Laban Satyagraha Movement

In the historical city of Paschim Midnapore, West Bengal, lives Sanatan Maity, a 91 year-old master trainer of Taant and Charkha at the Mat and Babui Grass Craft Cluster.

Born in 1931 in Katina village of the undivided Midnapore, he was inspired by the visit of Mahatma Gandhi to Noakhali in 1944, which is in present day Bangladesh. He underwent training in Gujarat to operate Taant (handloom) and came back to promote self-reliance through art amongst the village

Over the years, he has trained over 600+artisans in the Mat Craft. He preaches Gandhian philosophy and has composed poems and songs on the artform of mat weaving which are fondly sung by other mat weavers.

Maity ji's journey is a pledge towards 75 years of atmanirbharta (self-reliance) of upholding craft and economic independence for not only his family but also hundreds of families in his village.

Weavers of Rajasthan uphold the concept of Swadeshi

The artisan community of Meghwals were migrants from Sindh (Pre-Partition India) in 1947 and settled in the western region of Rajasthan. They practiced their ancestral craft of hand embroidery called *Kaseedakari* to earn their livelihood.

In 2020, the Urmul Natural Dye Cluster was set up in the Thar desert of Bikaner. 650 artisans were collectivised under SFURTI (MoMSME) out of which 600 are women.

Kaseedakari artisan *Rangubai* lives in 2DO village of Poogal block, Bikaner which has a population of 729. She has been practicing the craft for the past 25 years. After getting associated with the cluster, she has gained access to a wider market and earns INR 4,500-5,000 monthly.

Our geographical reach is spread to areas that were key grounds of the Indian freedom struggle. **Chandrasekhara Groundnut Cluster** is located in Dhenkanal District of Odisha which was a Princely State that merged into the Indian Union.

We highlight an unsung freedom fighter from Bhuban block where the cluster is located.

Baji Rout was born in Nilakanthapur village of Dhenkanal district in 1926. Remembered as the youngest freedom fighter, Rout lost his life at the age of 12 to the bullet of a British soldier, for refusing to ferry them across the Brahmani river at the Nilakantha Ghat of which he was an incharge as a boatman. The British had attacked Bhuban village at midnight of October 10, 1938 and were trying to flee the village.

Today, in Bhuban block, 770 farmers produce groundnut and value-added products like oil, seeds, salted and sweet chikki.




udya ME One stop solution for Micro Entrepreneurs




udyaME is a 'one stop shop' to cater to the unmet demands of the entrepreneur by delivering services through a network of Common Service Centre (CSC) called 'udyaME kiosks'. These kiosks act as a focal point for technology, finance, marketing and capacity building of microentrepreneurs.

In the last seven months, udyaME through the partnership with Rang De has enabled more than 700 entrepreneurs to grow their livelihoods through access to timely and low cost credit.

Surendra Khushwaha, 36 years old, runs an Information Kiosk in Kachhipur village in Niwari district, Madhya Pradesh, supporting his family of six members.

He holds a Bachelor degree in Computer Applications from Bhopal University and got placed at a reputed manufacturing company in 2008. Due to some circumstances, he lost his job in 2012. He then worked at the local agriculture department as a computer operator for two years in hope of becoming a regular employee, but his dreams were shattered. He had to come back to Niwari and work at a private firm earning INR 5000 per month. In 2018, he set up a Common Service Centre (CSC) enterprise in Tarichar village. He became part of the Work4Progress program and in December 2021, got access to a credit of INR 30,000 through our microcredit partner Rang De.

During COVID-19, he was also permitted by the District Administration to operate a mini-ATM to provide financial services to the community during the critical period. Through his udyaME kiosk, he aims to ease the process of availing loans for the community and also enable the youth in his village to become entrepreneurs through access to information.


